

1. CUHAS RESEARCH AT A GLANCE



One of the core functions of CUHAS is research. There has been a remarkable increase in research output, from **two publications in the year 2008 to 178 in 2023.**

This has is has been contributed to by the increase in the number of fundable research projects and grants (https://www.bugando.ac.tz/research.php) in collaboration with local and international institutions, the rise in young, vibrant, dynamic faculty across various fields, the improvement in the quality of postgraduate research supervision, and the implementation of supportive research and publication policies.

The increase in the quality of publication output aligns with one of the university's missions to "Search, discover, and communicate the truth to advance the frontiers of knowledge." In the past 10 years, one of the greatest discoveries has been a novel bacterial pathogen causing neonatal sepsis, named *Enterobacter bugandensis* (https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/26637818/).

Furthermore, during the same period, the university has significantly contributed to the formulation of guidelines and policies in areas of communicable and non-communicable diseases, such as antimicrobial resistance, schistosomiasis, sickle cell disease, hypertension, and stroke.

The university faculty members have been nationally and internationally recognized, serving as mentors for young research fellows, reviewers and editors for various international journals, and external examiners for postgraduate programs at various universities.

Recently, in 2024, two faculty members were nationally recognized: Prof. Mshana as the best national health scientist and Dr. Ambrose for publishing in high-impact factor journals.




